2125th Garrison Support Unit turns over reigns for processing Soldiers

FORT BRAGG — After almost three years of processing Reserve Component Soldiers through the Fort Bragg mobilization station, the 2125th Garrison Support Unit is being demobilized, with most of its Soldiers returning home to Georgia.

A ceremony honoring the Soldiers' service will be at 10 a.m. July 6 at Thunderbolt Field.

About 100 GSU Soldiers were activated October 2001 in support of Operation Noble Eagle, with another 200 or so being called up October 2002 and January 2003 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Once on active duty, the unit had several missions that ultimately earned it the Army's Superior Unit Award and the Deployment Excellence Award (Supporting Unit).

Since October 2001, the GSU has processed more than 37,000 Reserve Component Soldiers through Fort Bragg. The responsibility now falls to Montana's 652nd Area Support Group, commanded by Col. Elizabeth Rehwalt.
