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Fort Bragg 5-Day Forecast

(Valid 0500L 03 November 2016)

Thursday: Expect light patchy fog in the early morning hours and mostly cloudy skies throughout the day as a front is expected to approach overnight into Friday. Winds will be southwesterly at 10 mph gusting into the low-teens. The low temperature overnight will be around 58F with a high of 83F.


Friday: Expect rain showers in the early morning hours, with skies gradually becoming clear later in the day. Winds will shift becoming northerly with speeds around 15 mph and gusts into the upper 20 mph range. The low temperature will be around 58F overnight with a high around 67F.

Saturday: Expect clear skies with light northerly winds around 12 mph. The low temperature will be around 46F and the high around 65F.

Sunday: Expect clear skies and light, northerly winds under 10 mph. The low temperature will be around 44F and the high around 67F.

Monday: Expect mostly clear skies with northerly winds under around 10 mph, gusting into the low-teens. The low temperature will be around 45F and the high around 64F.



An elongated area of disturbed weather extends a few hundred miles south of the coast of Central America and southern Mexico. Development of this system is not expected during the next couple of days, but environmental conditions could become somewhat more conducive for development this weekend while the disturbance moves westward to west-northwestward.

- * Formation chance through 48 hours...low...near 0 percent
- * Formation chance through 5 days...low...20 percent

An elongated non-tropical area of low pressure located several hundred miles east-northeast of the northern Lesser Antilles continues to produce widespread cloudiness and showers over the central Atlantic, and is also producing winds to gale force. This system could acquire some subtropical characteristics late Friday or Saturday while it moves northward or north-northeastward over the north-central Atlantic. Additional information on this system can be found in High Seas Forecasts issued by the National Weather Service.
