MEMORANDUM FOR Soldiers and Civilians of XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg

SUBJECT: Corps Policy Letter #11: Tasking of 92R Parachute Riggers to Perform Non Rigger Duties

1. Reference. AR 750-32 (Air Drop, Parachute Recovery and Aircraft Personnel Escape Systems), 18 July 2008.
2. Applicability. This policy applies to all personnel assigned or attached to XVIII Airborne Corps.
3. Purpose. To establish installation policy for the tasking of Military Occupation Specialty (MOS) 92R, Parachute Riggers, to perform duties outside their MOS.
4. This policy memorandum supersedes XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg Master Policy #4, published on 14 November 2014.
5. Policy. MOS 92R Soldiers assigned to the 82d Airborne Division (11 QM Co) and 3d Sustainment Command (Expeditionary) (647 QM Co) who are certified and able to perform parachute Rigger duties IAW AR 750-32 will not be tasked to perform additional duties, used as Borrowed Military Manpower (BMM), used as cadre, or any other administrative taskings such as post/installation support.
  - a. Soldiers with the MOS of 92R who are unable to perform any parachute Rigger duties IAW AR 750-32 due to the lack of certification, medical profile, UCMJ, ETS, PCS, retirement or other circumstances that prevent them from performing these duties may be used to perform other administrative taskings. Performance of administrative taskings will only be for the period of time where the Soldier cannot perform parachute Rigger duties. Once the Soldier meets all requirements to perform Rigger duties, the Soldier will immediately return to Rigger duties.
  - b. Commander, 82d Airborne Division (82d Abn Div) and Commander, 3d Sustainment Command (Expeditionary) (3d ESC) will keep a record of all Soldiers assigned the MOS 92R who are not able to perform parachute Rigger duties and are being used to perform other duties. Records will include inclusive dates and reasons preventing the Soldier from performing parachute Rigger duties. Each command's G3 will monitor and limit internal taskings to their assigned QM company so as to not interfere with parachute Rigger duties. Records will be available for command inspections when requested. Riggers may perform duties required to support internal airborne operations.

c. The 82d Abn Div and 3d ESC will not provide Rigger or parachute support to non-XVIII Airborne Corps units, except for airborne elements of the 108th ADA Brigade, or activities unless directed by the XVIII Abn Corps ACofS, G3.

d. Airborne Special Operation Test Directorate (ABSOTD). 82d Abn Div and 3d ESC will continue supporting the ABSOTD with 7 Riggers on 90 day rotations as tasked by XVIII Abn Corps G3.

e. Non-Operational Taskings and Event Support. The 82d Abn Div and 3d ESC may at times be tasked by XVIII Abn Corps ACofS, G3 to support short duration events, tours, and recruitment activities that promote Rigger capabilities, the Army message, retention, and recruitment.

f. Operational Taskings. The 82d Abn Div and 3d ESC will continue to be tasked when/as required to meet FORSCOM directed deployment and individual augmentee requirements (WIAS) for Rigger capabilities and Soldiers.
